

PARISH NURSE—Mary Bilslend

We often get blood test results but we don't know if the number is good or bad. Here is a few of the more frequently run test results. It is also important to remember that each lab has its own normal values so these are not exact. The lab used for your tests can give you their norms.

Some results in complete blood count:

- Hemoglobin Male 13-18 gm/dL female 12-16 gm/dL
- Hematocrit Male 45-62% Female 37-48%
- Platelet count 150,000-350,000/mL
- White blood cell count (WBC) 4,300-10,800 cells/microL/cm mm (the micro sign is like a
- u with a long tail at the beginning.)
 Red blood cell count (RBC) 4.2-6.9 million cells/ microL/cu mm

Some results in electrolytes

- Calcium 8.2-10.6mg/dL (normally slightly higher in children)
- Chloride 98-106 mEq/L
- Magnesium 1.9-2.7mEq/L
- Potassium 3.5-5.4 mEq/L
- Sodium 133-146 mEg/L

Liver Function Tests

- Bilirubin Direct up to 0.4 mg/dL Total up to 1.0 mg/dL (alkaline)
- Phosphatase 50-160 units/L (normally

- higher in infants and adolescents)
- Protein (total and albumin) total 6.0-8.4 gm/dL Albumin 3.5-5.0 gm/dL
- Transaminases (alanine and aspartate) alanine 1-21 units/L aspartate 7-27 units/
- Prothrombin (PTT) 25-41 sec

Lipids

- Cholesterol less than 225 mg/dL (for ages 40-49Yr. This increases with age.
- Triglycerides 10-29yrs. 53-104mg/dL 30-39yrs. 68-115mg/dL 40-49 yrs. 66-130mg/dL 50-59 yrs. 75-163 mg/dL 60-69 yrs. 78-158 mg/dL over 70 yrs. 83-141 mg/dL

Other tests

- Urea nitrogen (BUN) 7-18 mg/dL BUN creatinine Ratio 5-35
- Oxygen Saturation (arterial) 96-100%
- Prostate-specific antigen (PSA) 0-4 ng/ml (likely higher with age)
- Alcohol 0 mg/dL (more than 0.1mg/dL normally indicated intoxication)

These are just a few of the tests that can be done on your blood. If you wonder about your results, ask your Dr. or nurse or lab technicians for results and what that may mean. Hope this may help you and answer a few questions you may have.
