## PARISH NURSE - Mary Bilslend

We know that spring is coming –hopefully sooner than later. Here are a few tips to keep in mind when you begin your spring jobs.

- 1. Use safety goggles, sturdy shoes, and long pants with machinery or chemical usage.
- 2. Protect hearing if operating equipment. If you have to raise your voice to be heard by someone arm length away, you may need hearing protection.
- 3. Be sure equipment is in proper working order.
- 4. Wear gloves to protect your skin from irritants, contaminants or cuts.
- 5. Use insect repellent containing DEET.
- 6. Follow instructions and warning labels on chemicals, lawn and garden equipment.
- 7. Reduce risk of sunburn and skin cancer by wearing long sleeves, wide brim hat and sunshades. Use a sunscreen with an SPF of at least 15 or higher.
- 8. Keep an eye on the thermometer. Be prepared to take the precautions needed if it gets hot or cold.
- 9. If working in hot weather, remember to drink plenty of liquids that do not contain alcohol or high sugar amounts as these will rob the body of the fluid needed.
- 10. Pay attention to heat related illness: high body temperature, headache, dizziness, rapid pulse, nausea, confusion or unconsciousness.
- 11. Remember if you have a contractor doing a job for you, you need to make sure that they have a good safety record. OSHA can site and fine the contractor and the employer if the worker is hurt.
