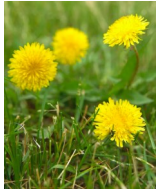

## LAWN CARE AND LANDSCAPING THIS SUMMER

When my family moved to Nebraska some years back, I noticed that people in St Paul, where I reside, are particularly interested in their yards. Some are enclosed in beautiful fences. Others are open without distinction from one lot to the other, except where the type of grass and diligence of care show the difference. So, being somewhere towards the end of June, it was already deep in the summer; hence the place was beautiful, with thickly green trees swinging from side to side as the wind blew and evidently neatly trimmed grass covering the beautiful lawns on every street.

Our eyes appreciate a beautiful yard or lawn, well-trimmed and free of dandelions and other weeds. The only difference is that some have to put in some effort for the yard to look great. We all know that no one wants their yard to look bad, but it can quickly happen if we don't put in some money, time, and effort. You see, one of the greatest enemies of our lawns is dandelion and crabgrass. You will have to kill them with some weed killer or sweat as you manually do it often. Failure to do that will cause your choicest grade of grass to be overrun by weeds and pests, making your yard an eyesore to your neighbor and passersby.

To the best of my knowledge, the other crucial requirement for a thriving lawn is watering. Of course, we all would love for rain every week, but that is not always possible. So, all those with beautiful lawns have to have a way of watering their grass, especially on those hot days of summer. If you forget about the grass, the scorching heat will dry the ground, and in no time, your grass will be gone. Then, a good fertilizer is vital too. You see, if you don't give the grass the right fertilizer, it will not thrive as expected. However, even if we provide all the grass needs without proper mowing, it becomes an ugly bush. So, after watering, applying fertilizer, and removing ugly weeds, one must regularly trim or mow the yard to bring out the beauty that people see.



God uses a similar analogy in **Isaiah 5:1-7**, where we find a story of a vineyard. God used it to speak to the children of Israel, who were very conversant with vines and vineyards. This vineyard had fertile soil, was cleared of stones, was protected with a watchtower, and was well pruned. This comparison shows how God takes care of his people as a gardener would do to his garden. He encourages us to do the same with our hearts. But how do we take care of our hearts? Remember, just like you go out daily to water your yard, get time for your soul. We must remain watered, or we will wither and die spiritually. Also, keep dandelions (*read sin*) from taking over all the excellent job you have been doing. They make even the most watered or well-fenced yard look bad. So, spray or pull them frequently. On the other hand, if you want to see a beautiful lawn, keep trimming it weekly, if not daily, using the word of God. If the enemy breaks the hedge to your yard, med it by prayer.

Yes! Let us enjoy the warm days ahead and still keep our spiritual yards healthy, clean, secured, and trimmed. If traveling or at home, let us not forget to join each other for the weekly worship services where we get watered and trimmed. If one of us misses mowing, call, check on them, and encourage them. When someone struggles with watering, let us water them with our prayers and encouraging words.

So, will your lawn remain green, well-trimmed, and free of dandelions this summer? May we all become beautiful lawns and vineyards of the Lord. **Pastor Geoffrey.**
