#### **Message from the Finance Committee...**

#### **FINISHING UP 2023**

Hello everyone! As we promised to keep you updated on our financial picture, we are here to say that by the grace of God, the year 2023 has been incredible. We all can attest that the work of the Lord has gone on smoothly despite our little limitations on the way. As we look forward to 2024, we stand amazed by the goodness of our God, who has carried us through the past ten months of this year. As the leadership of this church, we thank God for each one of you for stepping in when we reached out at the beginning of the year. With you, we have done a lot of ministries within and outside of our church. Many have testimonies of God's healing when we were sick, comfort when we were low, and victory when we went through a rough stretch.

Early this year, we received some wonderful gifts, and we were able to pay \$3,000 towards our current year's Conference Mission Shares. Ever since, we have just been breaking even and have not made any additional Mission Shares payments. For 2023, the church needed almost \$10,000 monthly to cover expenses.

#### **PREPARING FOR 2024**

As we prepare for the year ahead, the leadership feels encouraged by the effort each of you has given so far. Together, we will do ministry here more than ever before because we trust in a great God. Therefore, all we ask from each of us is to continue trusting in God that we can do all things through Him who gives us strength (*Phil 4:13*).

The budget for the year 2024 has already been drawn and shows that we must raise, on average, about \$10,500 per month, an increase from around \$10,000 per month needed in 2023. As you all know, inflation has hit everything from utilities to building insurance. The only item that decreased much is our Conference Mission Shares; otherwise, the budget would have been even higher.

At this point, we pray that you will consider the church for larger gifts around this vital season of Christmas to ensure we meet all our financial obligations this coming year. Yes, please don't forget the church! We count on your continued generosity.

Snow is just around the corner or may be here when this is published so here ae some tips that may be of benefit to you to help on those road trips.



It is handy to have a large tote with lid that will fit easily in your car to hold the items.

Put some LED flashlights to supply light if stalled and if someone needs to walk for help so have more than one. Also, include extra batteries.

Include a snow scraper. This is a necessity in cold weather. A brush or broom also helps if it snows a lot

A five pound bag of sand, road salt or kitty litter can also help add traction is the tires spin a little.

A good snow shovel is a necessity.

Chemical hand and foot warmers are handy and keep away frost bite.

Include warm clothes and blankets. Add extra gloves hats and heavier coats if it becomes necessary to stay warm or walk.

Food that has a long shelf life and can tolerate change in temperatures Something that does not need a stove or preparation other than opening a tin and include a can opener if needed. Include some water but be careful if you keep it in the car that it does not freeze and explode.

A pack of 30 min road flares are nice.

Spare wiper blades are nice if a bad storm affects the scrapers.

A Good first aid kit.

A small emergency tool kit that is well stocked.

Tire chains

There are apps that can turn your phone into a walkie talkie to get help and also good weather apps to keep you updated on the weather and roads.

Be sure the car insurance is up to date and supplies your needs in case of an accident, towing, and use of a car if your car is in the shop if needed.

Be sure your phone is charged and a car charger is also a great idea.

Stay safe and be prepared to go slow and check road conditions before you go. Go with God.
